FROM THE PRESIDENT AND CHAIRMAN

On January 11, 2017, the American Museum of Natural History unveiled preliminary designs for the planned Richard Gilder Center for Science, Education, and Innovation, a new facility to be built on the west side of the Museum campus.

The event was the culmination of many months of planning and development, including numerous meetings with New York

City and State representatives and agencies, community groups, and neighbors, and open meetings for public questions and feedback. The designs were the product of substantial research and creative work by architect Jeanne Gang of Studio Gang and exhibit designer Ralph Appelbaum, working in close association with the Museum’s scientific, education, exhibition, and operations staff.

The planned Gilder Center will be a spectacular, fully modern facility, showcasing the Museum as an active, integrated place of science and education,

rooted in its collections, imbued with technology, and informed by the ways people learn, discover, and interact today, while also helping us better host and serve some five million annual onsite visitors and hundreds of thousands of schoolchildren visiting in camp and class groups.

The presentation of the Gilder Center designs was a milestone that anchored the year’s ongoing work in science, education, and exhibition—work that seeks to find new, more effective ways to study the scientific issues of our time and to interpret science,

nature, and culture for a growing audience seeking trusted sources of information, education, and inspiration. In this complex time in which so many of our most pressing issues are science based, the Museum’s work of advancing scientific research, preparing the next generation of scientists and science teachers, and improving the public understanding of science is essential.

The annual report that follows details the many initiatives of the year that advanced our mission. We presented major exhibitions, one of which explored the biodiversity and culture of Cuba and another that showed how the latest technology is revealing the secrets of mummies. In October, we joined colleagues and officials in Columbus, Ohio, to mark a historic partnership with COSI, the Center of Science and Industry, to create two American Museum of Natural History galleries in its facility, one a dinosaur exhibition and one dedicated to presenting our special exhibitions.

Field work took our scientists around the world, while others pursued molecular and genomic research in our laboratories, based on our world-renowned collections of specimens and artifacts. These collections now exceed 34 million items, not counting digital astrophysics and genomic data.

In the summer of 2016, the Museum signed a groundbreaking memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the National Museum of Natural History in Havana, Cuba, formalizing what has been a longstanding collaboration between scientists at the two institutions and extending our partnership to education and exhibition initiatives.

The Museum conferred Ph.D. and Master of Arts in Teaching degrees on a new class

of young scientists and science teachers, as well as honorary degrees on Cuban zoologist Gilberto Silva Taboada and former U.S. Secretary of Education John B. King, Jr.

Education programs engaged a variety of audiences, ranging from documentary film lovers enjoying the Margaret Mead Film Festival to families learning together in family science adventures, including in a partnership with the New York City Housing Authority; from curious adults in conversation with pioneering scientists at SciCafe to preschool naturalists and their caregivers exploring nature in the Science and Nature Program; from computer coders who stayed up in an all-night “Hack the Stacks” hackathon challenge using the Research Library’s data sets to serious science lovers who took a five-part course in stem cell science. And far too much more to detail here.

As we look ahead to the Museum’s 150th anniversary in 2019–20, we continue to find new ways to express the Museum’s mission and to fulfill our role in this complex time.

We thank you for your interest and involvement and invite you to stay with us for what will be an exciting and transformative period for the Museum and all those who love it.

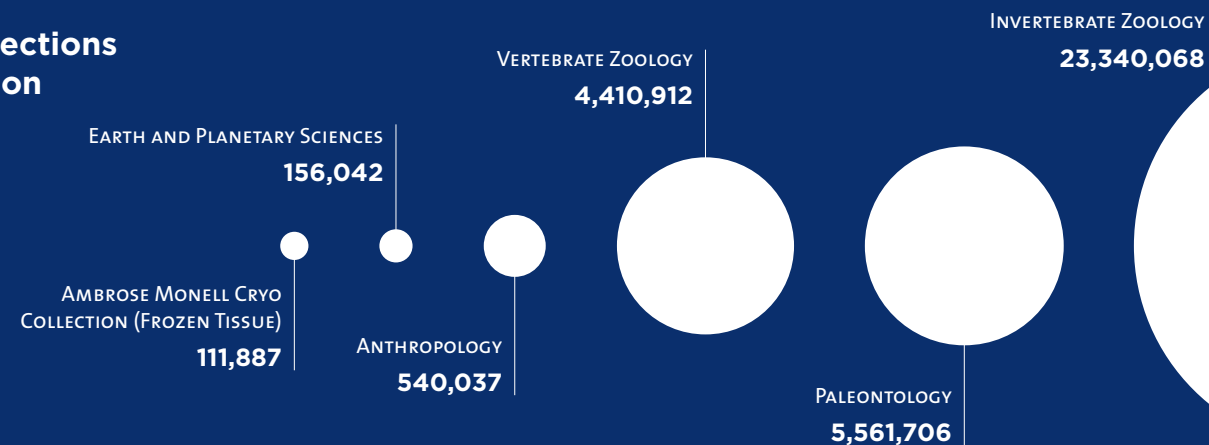

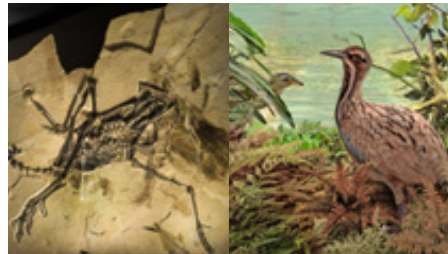

Dinosaur Eggs Were Slow to Develop

Using CT scans and powerful microscopes to examine the teeth of fossilized dinosaur embryos, Museum Curator Mark A. Norell and colleagues have found that the incubation period for embryos was much longer than those of today's avian species—sometimes as long as six months. During the Cretaceous-Paleogene extinction event, this drawn-out development cycle may have put dinosaurs at a disadvantage.

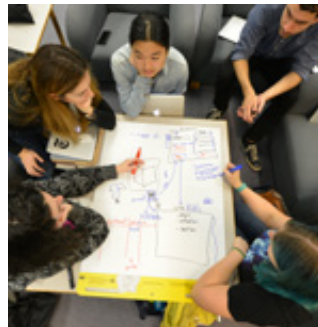

SAUROPODS AT THE MUSEUM

FEBRUARY 17, 2017

This new permanent display in the Wallach Orientation Center about the Museum's history of sauropod collecting includes fossils from the Museum's Big Bone Room, including a *Camarasaurus* tail and neck vertebrae, neck and skull fossils from the juvenile sauropod in the Theodore Roosevelt Rotunda, and the pelvis of *Diplodocus longus*, which was among the Museum's first non-avian dinosaur fossils and found by legendary dinosaur hunter Barnum Brown.

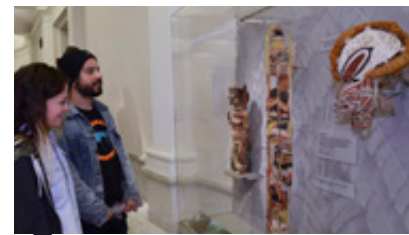
Shedding new light on ancient mummies that have been recently re-examined using 21st-century tools and technologies, this exhibition, co-curated by Curator of North American Archaeology David Hurst Thomas, and developed by The Field Museum, featured one of the largest collections of mummies housed in North America and provided an unparalleled glimpse into the lives and traditions of people from cultures of the past.



American Museum of Natural History Dinosaur Gallery at the Center of Science and Industry (COSI) in Columbus, Ohio

Announced September 2016

A unique collaboration with a leading science center, this gallery features current paleontological research from the American Museum of Natural History and spotlights the evolution of dinosaur biology. Highlights include a **40-FOOT-LONG** *T. rex* skeleton and a **700-SQUARE-FOOT** diorama of China's Liaoning Forest, one of the largest life-sized recreations of a prehistoric environment ever built. The American Museum of Natural History Dinosaur Gallery opened in November 2017. The adjacent American Museum of Natural History Special Exhibition Gallery, featuring special exhibitions on a rotating basis, opened in March 2018 with *Traveling the Silk Road*.



THREE MASKS OF BALI: A LIVING ARTISTIC TRADITION

REPORT OF THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER

Fiscal year 2017 marked another year of solid financial performance and growth in the Museum's net assets.

Due to continued strength in fundraising and attendance as well as ongoing financial discipline, the Museum generated positive net unrestricted operating revenues of \$113,312 in fiscal year 2017. This positive outcome was the net result after transfers of designated contributions and other revenues to plant and long-term investments.

The Museum's net assets increased by \$141.0 million, from \$896.8 million to \$1,037.8 million, during fiscal year 2017. Over the last five fiscal years, the Museum's net assets increased by \$355.4 million, or 52 percent, due to consistently strong Museum operations, continued strength in fundraising, endowment appreciation, restructuring of the Museum's long-term debt and reductions in the Museum's liabilities for postretirement health care.

UNRESTRICTED OPERATING RESULTS

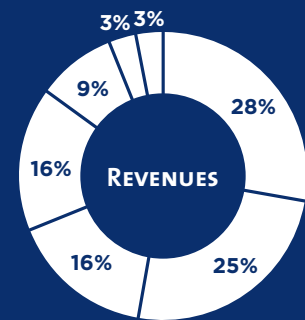
During fiscal year 2017, the Museum's annual unrestricted operating revenues and support increased by \$5.8 million, from \$186.3 million to \$192.1 million. Annual unrestricted operating expenses, together with transfers, also increased by \$5.8 million, from \$186.2 million to \$192.0 million for the same period, resulting in net unrestricted operating revenue and support of \$113,312 during fiscal year 2017.

The Museum continued to receive substantial operating and programmatic support from Trustees, other individuals, foundations, and corporations, as well as the City of New York, the State of New York, and the federal government. During fiscal year 2017, contributions and grants used to fund Museum operations, including a portion of net assets released from restrictions, totaled \$48.1 million. Additionally, the Museum received unrestricted operating support from the City of New York, including funding for certain energy and pension costs, totaling \$17.2 million. The City of New York also provided capital support to the Museum (see "Capital Expenditures").

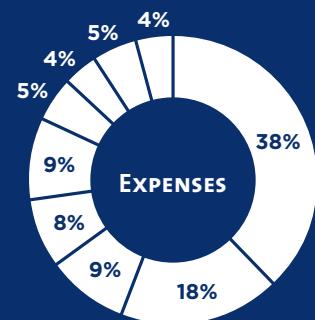
CAPITAL EXPENDITURES

In fiscal year 2017, the Museum invested \$28.6 million to fund priority capital improvement projects to meet infrastructure and security needs as well as permanent exhibition hall renovations and new

scientific facilities. As in the past, the Museum funded its capital improvements from a variety of sources, including the City of New York, State of New York, private donations, and the Museum's endowment.

The Museum recognized a non-cash depreciation expense of \$30.6 million during fiscal year 2017, which exceeded the Museum's \$28.6 million investment and resulted in a decrease of the value of the Museum's physical plant of \$2.0 million, from \$408.3 million to \$406.3 million.

DEBT AND OTHER LIABILITIES

The Museum's liabilities decreased by \$6.6 million during fiscal year 2017 from \$406.6 million to \$400.0 million. The decrease in liabilities was largely attributable to a \$10.7 million decrease in the valuation of the Museum's interest rate exchange liabilities related to its debt, reflecting higher interest rates used to value these liabilities. During fiscal year 2017, the Museum made principal payments of \$3.2 million on its long-term

debt, and borrowings on its lines of credit remained at zero.

ENDOWMENT FUNDS

The return on the Museum's endowment was +13.5 percent in fiscal year 2017, reflective of strong worldwide equity markets. Net of planned withdrawals from the endowment to provide funding for Museum operations and capital expenditures, as well as gifts and pledge payments to the endowment, the market value of the endowment increased by \$67.5 million in fiscal year 2017, from \$607.8 million to \$675.3 million.

The Museum's endowment asset allocation is intended both to drive investment return and to provide protection in volatile markets. The Museum's endowment funds are invested by independent investment managers in diversified equity and fixed income securities and are overseen by the Museum's Investment Committee. As of June 30, 2017, the Museum's endowment was invested as follows:

THE IMPORTANCE OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND GRANTS

The Museum continued to benefit greatly from the extraordinary generosity of its private and public supporters. During fiscal year 2017, the Museum raised a total of \$165.7 million in support of its operations, programs, capital improvements, and endowment—a major endorsement of the importance and social impact of the Museum's work in science, education, and exhibition. As a result, the Museum continued to balance its operating budget, enhance its programmatic offerings, and make improvements to its infrastructure and facilities.
