
BRAILLE KEY

Use this key to write and read Braille. Each letter, number, and punctuation is represented by dots in a "cell." Each cell is made up of six dots: two dots across and three dots down. The bolded dots are the ones that you will mark and punch through on the blank Braille sheet.

means the next word is ALL CAPITALIZED




The numbers 1–0 are the same as a–j, but with a number sign before it.


