Museum Entrances

The Museum is located at 200 Central Park West, New York, NY 10024 and has three entrances.

Getting to the Museum

Public Transportation

- Subway: Take the **B** (weekdays only) or **C** to 81st Street. Two blocks west of the Museum, the **1** train stops at Broadway and West 79th Street.

Please note: The 81st Street subway station is not wheelchair accessible. The closest accessible subway station is the 72nd Street station for the **1**, **2**, and **3** trains, with a connection on the northbound M7 on Amsterdam Avenue.

- Bus: The M79 bus travels east/west on West 79th Street across Central Park, with a stop next to the Museum on West 81st Street. Other buses also stop at or near the Museum, including the M7, M10, M11, M86, and M104 buses.

Parking

The Museum's parking garage is open from 6 am–11 pm on weekdays, 8 am–11 pm on weekends. Enter at 81st Street between Central Park West and Columbus Avenue (GPS address: 56 West 81st Street).

Dining

The Museum has four dining options:

- **The Restaurant at Gilder, 11:30 am–3:30 pm, Floor 2**
The Restaurant at Gilder offers table-service dining with a view overlooking the soaring architecture of the Kenneth C. Griffin Exploration Atrium.
- **Food Court, 10:45 am–4:45 pm, Lower Level**
A wide variety of selections for all ages and palates, with gluten-free and nut-free choices, and a menu that changes daily. A manager will be able to answer any questions about ingredients.
- **Cafe on 1, 11 am–4:30 pm, Floor 1**
Gourmet fare including panini sandwiches pressed to order and cheese and dried fruit plates. Desserts, espresso, and cold beverages are also served.
- **Cafe on 4, 11 am–4:30 pm, Floor 4**
Sandwiches, soups, salads, fruit, desserts, espresso, and cold beverages.



Eating is prohibited in Museum galleries. Visitors may leave and return using the same ticket on the same day. When re-entering the Museum, visitors must enter at the 81st Street or Central Park West entrances and must go back through the security line to be readmitted.

Storage Lockers

Store shopping bags, backpacks, coats, and personal items conveniently and securely.

- \$7 per day, small size (12.5 in x 11 in x 19.5 in; 32 cm x 28 cm x 50 cm)
- \$12 per day, large size (22 in x 11 in x 19.5; 56 cm x 28 cm x 50 cm)
- Storage lockers are available until 5 pm. Closing times are subject to change.

Not permitted:

Accessible Restrooms, Lactation Rooms, and Companion Care Room

There are accessible restrooms on every floor of the Museum.

There are also family/all-gender restrooms on Floors 1–4, lactation rooms on the Lower Level and Floor 3, and a companion care room with an adult changing table on Floor 1. These locations are ADA-accessible.

Code of Conduct

Please comply with the Museum Code of Conduct, including, but not limited to:

- All Visitors must pass through a security check.
- Visitors must wear appropriate attire, including shirts and shoes at all times.
- Children ages 12 and under must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- The Museum does not tolerate abusive, harassing, discriminatory, or threatening language or behavior.
- Visitors must follow directions from security guards or other Museum staff.

The following are prohibited:

- Eating and drinking within any of the exhibition halls or outside of designated areas.
- Explosives, firearms, knives, weapons, and noxious gases or substances or any item deemed by Museum staff to be a dangerous instrument.
- Outside food or drink (water bottles permitted).
- Dogs or other pets (service animals permitted).

The Museum reserves the right, at any time, to implement additional or more restrictive rules than these contained herein.
